# Out of Love

Dear Kids,

Do you love God?

I know many of you do and want to sincerely serve Him. You know that He is a good God and that He cares for you. He is indeed a good God and values every one of you. In Luke 12:6-7, Jesus says God cares for even such small things as sparrows. How much more is His love for you who are worth more than many sparrows! He even knows how much hair you have on your head!

Can you imagine how much He loves you?

As children of God, we have to give our whole hearts to Him. God has commanded us to love Him with all of our heart, with all of our soul, with all of our mind, and with all of our strength. In other words, to love Him with ALL that we are! This is the first and the greatest commandment.

There is another commandment that is also very, very important – love your neighbour as yourself. Jesus

sums up God's two greatest commandments in Mark 12:28-31.

Kids, do you love God?

Jesus says if you love Him, you will obey His commandments. If you really love someone, you will want to do what the person asks for.

So, if you love God, you must also ask yourself, "Do I love my neighbour?"

## Umm... is my neighbour the uncle next door?

A teacher of the law in the Bible also wanted to know. He asked Jesus, "Who is my neighbour?"

Jesus answered by telling a story about the Good Samaritan.

"30...A man was going down from Jerusalem to Jericho, when he fell into the hands of robbers. They stripped him of his clothes, beat him and went away, leaving him half dead.

<sup>31</sup>A priest happened to be going down the same road, and when he saw the man, he passed by on the other side.

<sup>32</sup>So too, a Levite, when he came to the place and saw him, passed by on the other side. <sup>33</sup>But a Samaritan, as he travelled, came where the man was; and when he saw him, he took pity on him.

<sup>34</sup>He went to him and bandaged his wounds, pouring on oil and wine. Then he put the man on his own donkey, took him to an inn and took care of him.

<sup>35</sup>The next day he took out two silver coins<sup>[c]</sup> and gave them to the innkeeper. 'Look after him,' he said, 'and when I return, I will reimburse you for any extra expense you may have.'

<sup>36</sup>"Which of these three do you think was a neighbour to the man who fell into the hands of robbers?"

<sup>37</sup>The expert in the law replied, "The one who had mercy on him." Jesus told him, "Go and do likewise."

So, is your neighbour the uncle next door?

Well, yes... but more than that. Your neighbour can be anyone, but especially those who need your help. Just like the poor man who almost died and needed help, your neighbour is anyone who is in trouble and needs your help.

## Love is not only saying, but also doing

In church, Eileen was learning about the children who lived all over the world. She thought of all these children, just like her, living in China, India, Alaska, Australia, Africa. Their lives must be so different, she thought. But she felt close to all these children because in many ways, they were the same. When the teacher finished sharing, Eileen leaned over and told her, "I love all of Heavenly Father's children."

In class, just a few minutes later,
Peter came over and sat down next
to Eileen. Peter was new in town, and
didn't really dress very well. He
spoke in a funny way, and combed
his hair differently with his hair
parted too much to the side. Eileen
had laughed before when her
classmates made fun of Peter, and
when he sat down and said "Hi",
Eileen heard someone giggle.
Suddenly, she felt very embarrassed
sitting next to Peter. Without saying
anything, she got up and moved to
the seat behind.

For the rest of the lesson, Eileen had

a bad feeling inside. She kept looking at Peter, who sat quietly, looking down at his feet in embarrassment all throughout the lesson. Eileen wished she had acted differently. She thought of how she had also felt the same way a few times in school when her friends made fun of her for 'always being so good'. The bad feeling in her grew as she remembered how embarrassed she was for being 'different'. She also remembered feeling sad and lonely. When class was over, she hurried over to Peter's side and caught his arm. "I'm sorry I moved away Peter," she said. "Would you like to meet for recess tomorrow in school?"

Peter's face lighted up and broke into a happy grin, and Eileen's bad feelings immediately disappeared.

# Praying for those around us who are in need

In Malaysia, there are many groups of people who are in need of our prayers. During this 40-Day Fast and Prayer, let us pray for our neighbours. The main groups of people who really need our prayers are:

- The Poor: Those who have very little or do not have enough money
- The Excluded: Those who are rejected by the community because of the way they live

- The Migrants: Those from other countries who have come to Malaysia to work
- The Indigenous Peoples: The natives from Sabah and Sarawak, and the Orang Asli

We will also pray for our country to be fair and upright so that the suffering of those in need will be lessened. We must pray that Malaysia will be a nation who cares for those in need.

### An important note!

### PRAYING WITH THE WORD OF GOD

When we pray, it is good to pray with the Word of God. Why?

### God says:

11 so is my word that goes out from my mouth: It will not return to me empty, but will accomplish what I desire and achieve the purpose for which I sent it.

~ Isaiah 55:11 (NIV)

Praying with the Word of God is very effective. This is because...

When we pray God's word, His words will not return to Him empty. That means He will do something. This is because we are confirming what He has said and we are praying what is in HIS HEART. So, there is power in the words that we pray and our prayers will bear fruits!

### Let's look at an example:

Let's say you want to ask God to help you love your neighbour. You can pray...

Dear Father,

#### Psalms 139 -

You know when I sit and when I rise; you perceive my thoughts from afar.

<sup>3</sup> You discern my going out and my lying down; you are familiar with all my ways.

<sup>4</sup> Before a word is on my tongue you know it completely, O LORD.

You know what is in my heart. You know when I sit and when I rise. You know my very thoughts.

You know when I go out and when I lie down. You are familiar with all of my ways.

Before I even say a word, you already know what I am going to say.

#### Psalms 139 -

<sup>23</sup> Search me, O God, and know my heart;
 test me and know my anxious thoughts.
 <sup>24</sup> See if there is any offensive way in me,
 and lead me in the way everlasting.

Search me O God, and know my heart,

See if there is any way in me that you are not pleased with,

Correct me if I have any wrong attitudes,

And lead me and guide me in your ways.

### Mark 12:31 -

...You shall love your neighbour as yourself.

Help me Father, to love my neighbour as myself,

As that is one of the greatest commandments in the Bible.

#### John 14:15 -

If you love me, obey my commandments.

You say that if I love You, I would do as You say,

Help me Father then, to do as You say,

Give me the willingness in my heart to love my neighbour,

Because I love You and want to be obedient to You,

Help me to love my neighbour.

I pray this in Jesus' precious name, Amen!

### **BOUND BY GOD'S LOVE**

I have been serving as an officer in the Girls' Brigade in Kuching since 1985. The Girls' Brigade is an international, inter-denominational Christian uniform organisation. Its motto is "Seek, Serve and Follow Christ". The activities in Girls' Brigade are based on four aspects – spiritual, physical, educational and social. Membership is opened to girls aged six and above (non-Muslims).

One Saturday, during our Girls' Brigade worship time, the Lord prompted me to give this word: "Be still and listen to what God wants to say to you." Yet another said, "God asks me to be kind to my friend." Many times, God has encouraged me through the simplicity of these little cadets. # Loving our neighbours who are poor and excluded

# Interview with Rev. Henry, the president and founder of a social organisation, about loving our neighbours...

### How do you and your team love your neighbours?

We try our best to help people and walk that extra mile with all our strength to help the needy and the abandoned. The foundations of Christian teachings definitely highlight the importance of love and being compassionate.

### What is needed to love your neighbour?

To love a neighbour, we have to be caring, sharing and not expect anything back in return. This basically revolves around the fact of being a good human being. This is what we feel loving a neighbour is all about.

"Going that extra mile to help the needy and abandoned and not expecting anything in return" – that is at the heart of loving our neighbour. These two things that Rev. Henry points out show the attitude that we all should have when we reach out to love our neighbours.

### Jesus says:

'If someone forces you to go one mile, go with him two miles' – (Matthew 5:41).

'If you love those who love you, do you deserve any thanks for that? Even sinners love those who love them' – (Luke 6:32).

Jesus clearly teaches us to do more than what is 'normal' or what is 'required' of us. Going that extra mile and not expecting anything in return from others is something many of us will not do. Without God, that is how we will think and behave. This is how the world thinks and behaves as well. But because God's love is in us, we can be MORE than what a person without God would normally do – we can give more than what is required, we can

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love our neighbours as much as we love ourselves. Because God has poured out His love on us, we too, having received His love, can also pour out abundant and generous love on others.

Rev. Henry is a good example of a Christian who lives out God's command to 'Love our neighbour'. The non-profit organisation that he runs (Perkhidmatan Sosial dan Pembangunan Komuniti) focuses on helping single mothers and their children. Volunteers from the local community help him to run the organisation. A big cheer to Rev. Henry and his team, as well as other organisations which are willing to 'love their neighbour'!

Let us be encouraged and inspired to do the same as well!

# Loving our neighbours who are losing their homes and who do not have much

### THE PLIGHT OF THE INDIGENOUS PEOPLES

In Sarawak, the natives are facing a lot of problems relating to their land. When Malaysia was formed, the natives were given special rights to own certain areas of land. However, at present, the Government does not respect them as the rightful owners of this land. In many cases, their land is given over to business developers without even informing them. As a result, they will only find that their land has been taken away when bulldozers and tractors come to develop the land.

So far, there have been about 200 reported cases. This shows how serious the problem is. The usual length of time to get one case looked into is six to seven years. Some of the problems that the natives face are: the Government's unwillingness to recognise certain areas of land as belonging to the natives, and the difficulty the natives face in proving that they are the owners of the land. Also, when the natives make police reports on their land issue, the police usually ignore the cases and sometimes even mistreat them.

The Orang Asli is also facing a similar situation regarding their land. The land that they have been occupying for many centuries is now being slowly taken away from them. This situation has caused a lot of anger among them.

### THE GROWING MIGRANT GROUP

Many of the migrants in Malaysia are foreign workers who work in airports, hotels, restaurants, petrol stations, domestic services, and so on. Their number has grown over the years. In 2006, it was reported that there were 1,823,431 foreigners from at least 22 countries in Malaysia. In 2008, the number was reported to be 2.01 million. These migrant workers now play an important role in the workforce in Malaysia. The top five groups of migrants in our land are the Indonesians, Nepalese, migrant Indians (from India), Vietnamese and Bangladeshi. With this huge number, we cannot ignore the fact that the migrants have become our neighbours in our land!

Along with the growing population of migrant workers, there are also many illegal immigrants in the country. Many of these illegal immigrants have

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run away from their own home countries because of dangerous conditions back home. However, they face a lot of hardship and difficulty here in Malaysia because they lack food, shelter, money and legal protection. We as Christians need to pray for God's protection to be on them as they try to survive in unsafe conditions in our land.

# LOVING OUR NEIGHBOURS WHO ARE LOSING THEIR HOMES AND WHO DO NOT HAVE MUCH

Both the indigenous peoples and the migrants need our compassion, mercy, prayer, and above all, our help and action. Many times, their struggles are 'unseen' or 'invisible' to us, especially when we do not take the time to find out about their problems.

# Praying for those in authority to make a difference in the public

#### THE BOY AND THE STARFISH

### **DOING OUR PART**

Have you ever found yourself thinking, "No, I won't do it, what difference does it make?"

The man in the story didn't see any point in doing anything to help the starfish, but the boy knew better.

"It made a difference to that one".

The boy understood that although he couldn't save all the starfish stranded on the beach, he could still do something to help a few starfish.

### This week, we will be praying about making a difference in the public.

The public refers to all the people in a community or the nation. To pray for the public means to pray for all the people. This may seem like a huge effort, too huge for our 'little' prayers. But, let's be like that little boy who saved some starfish. If he had thought about saving all the starfish, he probably would have just thrown up the idea of saving some. It'd be too big a job for him. But he concentrated on what he could do, and that's what we should do too.

In the Bible, there was also another boy who made a difference to thousands of people, a huge number that he probably never imagined. He was the boy with five loaves and two fish who brought what he had to Jesus. He couldn't possibly feed the thousands of men and women who were there at the time, but he did not let that stop him. He did his part anyway. The rest of the task was left to Jesus, who multiplied his offering many, many times over.

As Christians, let us just do our part without worrying too much about whether we can make a big difference. (We CAN!) We have a mighty God who will turn our 'little' to 'much'. We just need to cooperate with Him. Together with Him, we WILL make a difference.

### WHY IS LIGHT SO IMPORTANT?

Do you know?!

Without light, there would be no sight.

Humans and animals can see an object because it reflects light. When the light reaches our eyes, signals are sent to our brain. Our brain decodes the information and tells us what the object is. This whole process is a complex one, however, it would not be possible if there is no light present.

If you turned off the room lights for a moment and then cover all the windows with black coloured paper to prevent light from entering the room, you would notice that nothing in the room can be seen. Even though there are objects, eyes, and a brain, the room and everything in it would look completely black, simply because there is no light!

In fact, without light, we can't even be seen by others. The only reason why other people can see us is that we are reflecting the light that comes from the sun.

### REFLECTING THE LIGHT OF GOD

As the light of the world, we should not hide our light. Who lights a lamp and then puts it under a bowl? The light from the lamp would be useless then! What should be done is to put the lamp on a stand so that everyone in the house can see the surrounding. If we hide our light, there will be no sight. The world will not be able to see God, who is the Light in us. When we let our light shine by doing good deeds, by doing what is right, people will see God and praise our Father in heaven.

So kids, remember, don't hide your light! Do good to stay bright!
